A growing global public health issue, especially for older men



8.5 million individuals were living with PD in 2019 worldwide¹



The 2nd most common neurodegenerative disorder (after AD)²



Prevalence has doubled over the past 25 years³



1.4 times more common in men than women³



A major cause of disability

Responsible for 1.1% of DALYs in people over 75 years of age in 2019 worldwide⁴

Significant human and healthcare costs

Burden on carers



Carers of 115 patients with moderate-toadvanced PD averaged 71 years of age, 66% were female, and median care time was 16 hours/day, 63% helped with dressing and 50% helped with feeding⁵

Estimated cost in the United States



52 billion year⁶

2500 for medications/person⁶

100,000 for therapeutic surgery/person⁶
